Many New Beginnings

Fall will be here before you know it, and with the change in seasons comes the excitement of the beginning of many ministries! Kids filling up the halls for R.O.C.K. in LOGOS, high school students rushing to the basement sharing stories from their first day of class, music and laughter coming from the Friendship Ministry room filling the halls with the sweet sounds of worship. You might be thinking SLOW DOWN, WHAT’S THE RUSH, SUMMER’S NOT OVER but every new beginning requires lots of preparation! So even as you are still soaking up the sun, enjoying lemonade in the shade, realize that soon enough, many ministries will be beginning again!

Because of our passion to see youth, children and vulnerable adults, ministered to in a safe nurturing community of faith, we have worked tirelessly for over a year in preparation for this fall. With the approval of our Church Council on June 26th the Safe Sanctuaries Ministry guidelines will be implemented with the beginning of all fall ministries. We are thankful that our congregation has taken this enormous step in developing and implementing this child protection policy that protects not only our children, youth, and vulnerable adults, but also our paid and volunteer providers who feel called to journey with them on their walk of faith.

Before the excitement of fall begins, now is the time to get prepared for those joyful days with our children, youth and vulnerable adults. Every person involved in a ministry with children, youth or vulnerable adults will need to prepare to serve in that ministry by attending a Safe Sanctuaries training opportunity and completing a volunteer form. What a blessing it is to have so many people involved in these ministries!

Prepare yourself for these new beginnings by setting aside either August 26th or September 23rd to participate in the necessary training. This training must be completed for all who will be working with children, youth or vulnerable adults. We want to provide every opportunity for you to be prepared to serve God in our Safe Sanctuary. Let’s prepare our hearts and minds even now for the beginning of all God will do in our youth, children, and vulnerable adults!

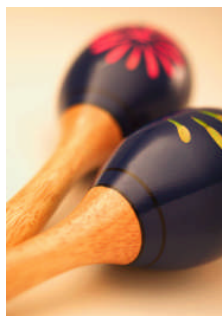

What promises does the gospel offer for living a life of continued growth, love and wisdom? Readers identify their fears and learn to make the most of God's gift of longer life.

Disciple Courses

(Disciple I is a prerequisite for all other long term Disciple Studies. It will be offered this year. Other Disciple Classes will be offered if facilitators are available.)

Disciple I "Becoming Disciples through Bible Study" - a 34 week study of the Old and New Testaments.

Disciple II "Into the Word into the World" - a 32 week study of Genesis, Exodus, Luke and Acts.
