“The Last Lap”

In today’s staff meeting we were trying to pull together all the loose ends, in order for all the church programs to ramp up for the fall term, because September 1st starts the final quarter of the calendar year – 2008. However, it is also the first quarter of our church’s program year. It seems for so many of us, whether or not we have youth in the school system, the school calendar seems to drive our family and church schedule.

- We’ll start up our two sanctuary worship services (9:00 am & 11:15 am) on Sunday, September 14th.
- With the Ministry Fair and Sunday School Open House (Sept. 14) the fall season will be up and running.
- Lil’ SAINTS will begin their fall session on Tuesday, September 16th. If you have or know of pre-school children who want a great learning experience with other children, get them enrolled right away.
- R.O.C.K. in LOGOS students will be filling this place on Wednesday’s beginning September 24th.
- Program teams and committees are back to meeting monthly in order to get all their work accomplished.
- Educational and spiritual growth opportunities for adults will begin within a very short time.
- Jr. & Sr. High youth activities for the fall are being planned and promoted.
- This year’s Confirmation Class will begin September 17th for first year confirmands.
- Vocalists and instrumentalists involved in our music department will soon be practicing each week.
- We’ll soon be ramping up for Church Conference, Stewardship Campaign and for Advent and Christmas. I’m not wishing away our life, but as we often put it, “before we know it” we will be gathering in the sanctuary, singing carols, lighting candles and celebrating the birth of the Messiah.

Also this week is the last lap before our Miracle Sunday – September 7th. The countdown has begun. Remember: there will be only one service that Sunday – 9:30 am. Come on this first Sunday following Labor Day and join your church family in celebrating what God is doing through the people of First UMC of Saline and what God will be doing because of the commitment of the people of this congregation. The 7th will be a great celebration day.

In addition to all that’s happening around here, we are rapidly moving toward the finish line in our effort to fill backpacks and provide school supplies for children. This week, 100 of the 125 backpacks that were picked up by members of the church are now in transit to Mexico. If you still have one to fill, do it and bring it in so the final 25 can be shipped to Tapestries of Life. Also, the Washtenaw Intermediate School District and Saline Social Services are distributing the school supplies that we’ve donated to them. They expressed deep appreciation for our church’s participation because the need for helping children living on our doorsteps is also very great.

I guess if a Church attempts to pattern itself on the life of the Risen Christ then the last lap of one endeavor becomes the first lap of the next. There is something exhilarating, though maybe a bit exhausting in those ending/beginning movements; but I, for one, am so thrilled to be part of a church that’s alive & well. - Pastor Jim
